Your Excellency,

As a member of Amnesty International I am seriously concerned about the impunity benefiting those responsible for human rights violations during the former military government and urge that those responsible be brought to justice.

I believe that if the Amnesty Law Decree 2191 were repealed investigations into abuses committed before 1978 would be less likely to be blocked by the courts.

I would like to draw to your attention the case of ANTONIO ANINAO MORALES, a 49 year old farmer who lived on a small holding near Melipeuco. He stood for a municipal post and campaigned for better conditions for Mapuche Indians. He was detained by police on September 11th. 1973 and disappeared from the police station on September 24th. 1973. I welcome the judicial investigation being conducted into this case and hope that the full truth will emerge and those responsible be brought to justice.

Amnesty International believes that adequate investigation into human rights abuse sends a clear message that violations of human rights will not be tolerated and those who commit such acts will be held fully responsible.
