Integra las Comisiones de Apropiaciones (donde preside el Subcomité de Operaciones Foráneas) y de Asuntos Judiciales (integra el Subcomité de Patentes y Marcas Registradas).

Nació el 31 de marzo de 1940. Es católico. Es Senador desde 1974 y le corresponde presentarse a reelección en 1992.

En su calidad de Presidente del Comité de Agricultura le correspondió dirigir la negociación para aprobar la ley agrícola 1991 y participar en la Conferencia ("Conference"), con la Cámara de Representantes, donde se consideró el tema de los Marketing Orders para los kiwis, nectarines, ciruelas y manzanas. Cuando se debatieron en el Senado las proposiciones de los Senadores Heinz y Specter proponiendo la inspección de la fruta chilena sujeta a Marketing Order se hiciera en el puerto de origen o con standards menos exigentes que los que se aplican en la actualidad en el puerto de entrada a los EE.UU., el Senador Leahy se opuso.

En su calidad de Presidente del Subcomité de Operaciones Foráneas le ha correspondido participar en la recomendación para aumentar el Fondo de Garantía para la Construcción de Viviendas en nuestro país a US\$ 25 millones; la asignación de recursos para el fortalecimiento de un poder judicial independiente en nuestro país y la autorización para la venta de repuestos y herramientas, manuales y otros elementos para los aviones F-5, C-130 y A/T37 de la FACH.

Como integrante del Comité de Asuntos Judiciales participó recientemente en la audiencia que tuvo que pronunciarse en la elección del Sr. Souter como integrante de la Corte Suprema de los Estados Unidos.

Tiene un cuñado sacerdote que reside en Chile, y que anteriormente dirigió el Colegio Saint George; el padre Claude Pommerlau.

4.- Creo de suma importancia que S.E. el Presidente reciba al Senador Leahy. Puede ser de gran utilidad para dos temas importantes: a) Enmienda Kennedy, b) temas comerciales, eventualmente Sistema Generalizado de Preferencias.
