1.- Cúpleme remitir a US. como anexo al presente oficio, una comunicación que ha hecho llegar a esta Embajada el Presidente del Capítulo malasio del Consejo de Cooperación Económica del Pacífico (PECC), Dato' Dr Noordin Sopiee, por medio de la cual invita a S.E. el Presidente de la República don Patricio Aylwin a participar como orador en la X Conferencia General del Consejo de Cooperación Económica del Pacífico (PECC), la que se celebrará en esta ciudad entre el 22 y 24 de Marzo de 1994. El tema de la exposición requerida es : "Open Regionalism: The Way Forward".


