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Dear Mr President

I am writing to you because I feel strongly that human rights should be respected throughout the world. The human rights abuses that have taken place in Chile give me great cause for concern.

Since 1992 is being marked in a number of countries as the 500th anniversary of the arrival of Europeans on the continent of America, it seems a particularly appropriate time to highlight the concern that is felt with respect to unresolved human rights violations against the indigenous peoples.

I would draw your attention to the case of Nelson Wladimiro Curinir Lincoqueo, a Mapuche Indian, who appears to have been extrajudicially executed in 1973.

I welcome the investigation into his killing, but I would urge that this investigation be pursued until the full truth emerges and those responsible for his death be brought to justice. I believe that the amnesty law of 1978 constitutes an obstacle to clarifying past abuses and preventing their recurrence. I therefore urge you to repeal this law.
