As a novelist and writer for British television I respectfully wish to convey to you my concern for the human rights of indigenous peoples in Chile. In particular I would like to express my grave concern about the extrajudicial execution of Nelson Wladimiro Curinir Lincoqueo in 1973. I would humbly ask you if you could tell me if there has been any progress in the investigation into this murder and if those responsible have yet been brought to justice.

Could you also please tell me what other measures have been adopted to prevent civil rights violations in Chile and note that I believe that the amnesty law of 1978 constitutes an obstacle to clarifying past abuses and preventing their recurrence and that therefore I believe that the law should be repealed.

I look forward to hearing from Your Excellency urgently in connection with this serious matter.
