Your Excellency,

We are writing to you on behalf of Mauro Gonz lez Quispe, Ren Larico Aguilar and Lisbert Fausto Mamani Morales. We are aware that these men have been sentenced to death for the murder of two Chilean students in January of 1992.

We understand the allegations of this case to be the following: that Gonz lez Quispe, Larico Aguilar and Mamani Morales crossed the border between Peru and Chile, carrying weapons. On the evening of January 31st, 1992 they allegedly kidnapped Marjorie Navarro and Alexander Orrego in La Lisera, a beach close to Arica. It is believed that these two students were then taken to the Pampa de Copda, where they were shot and buried by Mr. Quispe, Mr. Aguilar and Mr. Morales.

We write to you to welcome your opposition to the death penalty and to request that you exercise your power of clemency and commute the death sentences of Mauro Gonz lez Quispe, Ren Larico Aguilar, and Lisbert Fausto Mamani Morales.

As members of Amnesty International, we are in total opposition to the death penalty and thus we respectfully ask you to ensure Chile's abolition of the death penalty.

We look forward to hearing from you on this most urgent matter.
